Founded by German immigrants in 1745, St. John's Lutheran Church is one of the oldest congregations in the North Carolina Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We are part of a rich heritage that now spans 184 congregations and 45,000 Lutherans in North Carolina, nearly 3 million ELCA members across 65 synods in the United States, and a global communion of 78 million Lutherans through the Lutheran World Federation.

From a humble meetinghouse in 1745 to our place in the global body of Christ, St. John's continues to share God's love far beyond our own walls, living into the promise of the communion of saints.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

Joy: Rest Stops and Surprises

Long trips can wear you down. That's when a rest stop, a cool drink of water, or even an unexpected laugh can make all the difference. Advent joy shows up like that — in surprising places.

Isaiah imagines the desert bursting into bloom, the weak becoming strong, the ransomed returning home with singing. James urges patience like a farmer waiting for rain — trusting that joy is growing even when we can't yet see it. And in Matthew, Jesus points to the surprising work of God: the blind see, the lame walk, the poor hear good news. Joy doesn't erase our weariness, but it refreshes us for the road ahead.

"The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom" (Isaiah 35:1). On this road of Advent, we light the candle of joy, for God gives refreshment and gladness along the way.

Joy meets us when we least expect it.

God refreshes us for the journey.

Today we light the candles of hope, peace, and joy, celebrating God's surprises along the way.

Christ is our light and our home.

The first three candles are lit.


SECOND READING: JAMES 5:7-10


'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

- **h.** To emphasize partnership with the synod and churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as well as cooperation with other congregations, both Lutheran and non-Lutheran, subject to established policies of the synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- i. To recommend and encourage the use of program resources produced or approved by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - j. To seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel.

On behalf of your sisters and brothers in Christ, I ask you:

Will you accept and faithfully carry out the duties of the offices to which you have been elected? *Newly Elected Leaders:* I will, and I ask God to help me.

The congregation stands.

People of God, I ask you:

Will you support these, your elected leaders, and will you share in the mutual ministry that Christ has given to all who are baptized?

Congregation: We will, and we ask God to help us.





POST COMMUNION PRAYER


