Welcome, young explorers, to an amazing adventure where we'll discover how even the tiniest acts of faith can grow into something truly extraordinary. Just like a little mustard seed grows into a big tree or a small bit of yeast helps a whole loaf of bread rise, God's love helps us do great things!

Tiny Seeds, Big Dreams

This week we are going on a five-day adventure through two of Jesus's favorite stories – the Parable of the Mustard Seed and the Parable of the Yeast. Get ready to discover how the smallest things can do the biggest things for God!

Key Verse

"The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches."
— Matthew 13:31-32

Today's Big Idea

Small things matter to God! Jesus told his friends about a mustard seed. It is one of the tiniest seeds you can find – so small it can sit on the tip of your finger. But when you plant it in good soil and give it water and sunlight, it grows into a huge tree. Birds fly from far away just to rest in its branches.

That is exactly how God's kingdom works. It started with one person, Jesus, and twelve friends called disciples. From that tiny beginning, the good news of Jesus spread to the whole wide world!

Reflection Questions

Have you ever planted a seed or watched something grow? What happened?

Why do you think Jesus used a tiny seed to describe God's kingdom?

Can you think of something small that has made a big difference in your life?

Today's Prayer

Dear Jesus, thank you for reminding us that small things matter. Help us remember that your kingdom started small and grew big because of your love. Help our faith grow just like that mustard seed. In Jesus's name we pray, Amen.

A Little Yeast Goes a Long Way

Today we are learning about something you might find in your kitchen! Jesus told a story about yeast, a tiny ingredient that changes everything it touches. Even though you can hardly see it, it makes bread rise and grow fluffy and warm and delicious.

Key Verse

"The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough."

— Matthew 13:33

Today's Big Idea

Yeast looks like tiny white grains, almost like sand or even sprinkles. You stir it into flour, add some water or milk, a little sugar and salt, and something amazing starts to happen. The dough slowly puffs up and grows bigger. That tiny bit of yeast changed the whole big bowl of dough from the inside out!

Jesus says that is how his love works in us. When we invite Jesus into our hearts, his grace and goodness start changing us from the inside out. It might happen slowly, but it spreads through everything we do and say and feel.

Reflection Questions

Have you ever helped make bread or watched dough rise and get bigger? How did that feel?

How do you think Jesus's love changes people from the inside out?

Name one way you have noticed God's love changing the way you act or feel.

Today's Prayer

Dear Jesus, come into our hearts and change us from the inside out, just like yeast changes dough. Let your love spread through everything we do today. Help us be kind, gentle, and full of your goodness. In Jesus's name we pray, Amen.

You Are Small and That Is Okay!

Did you know that being small is not a problem? In fact, Jesus loves to use small people and small things to do great and wonderful things. Today we are going to discover that even YOU, right now, can do big things for God's kingdom!

Key Verse

"Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity."

— 1 Timothy 4:12

Today's Big Idea

Sometimes we think we have to be big and grown up to do something important for God. But that is not true at all! Think about that tiny mustard seed. It does not wait until it is bigger to start growing. It starts right away, right where it is planted.

You can do things for God right now, today, while you are still small. You can smile at someone who is sad. You can give a hug to a friend who needs one. You can pray for your family. You can show love to people around you. Each of those things is like planting a tiny mustard seed. You never know how big it might grow!

Reflection Questions

What is something small you did recently that made someone else feel happy?

How does it make you feel to know that God can use you right now, even while you are still young?

Who is one person you can show love to today, just like a tiny mustard seed being planted?

Today's Prayer

Dear Jesus, thank you that we do not have to wait to grow up before we can serve you. Help us to pray, to love, and to smile at others today. Show us one person we can encourage. In Jesus's name we pray, Amen.

God's Kingdom Grows and Grows

Today we are going to look at how God's kingdom started very small and grew into something that reached the whole wide world. Just like the mustard seed that grew into a tree where many birds could rest, God's family has grown to include people from every country and language on earth!

Key Verse

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

— Acts 1:8

Today's Big Idea

Jesus started his ministry in a small, ordinary place called Galilee. He chose twelve regular people, many of them fishermen, to be his disciples. That is a very small beginning for something that would change the whole world!

From that tiny group in Galilee, the good news of Jesus spread and spread, just like yeast through dough, just like a mustard tree growing tall enough for birds to nest. Today, billions of people around the world follow Jesus. Every single one of them is part of that same tree that started from one small seed planted long ago.

Reflection Questions

How do you think those twelve disciples felt being chosen by Jesus to help him?

How can you help spread the good news of Jesus to people around you?

Today's Prayer

Dear Jesus, thank you that your kingdom is big enough for everyone. Help us to share your love so that more and more people can become part of your family. Use us as tiny seeds that grow something beautiful for you. In Jesus's name we pray, Amen.

Size Is Not Important

We have made it to the last day of our devotional! Today we are going to put it all together. We have learned about mustard seeds, yeast, disciples, and how God's kingdom grows. Now let us celebrate the big truth we have discovered: size is not important to God. What matters is faith, love, and saying yes to him!

Key Verse

"Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

— Matthew 17:20

Today's Big Idea

All week long we have seen one amazing truth repeated over and over again. God loves to take small things and make them into something wonderful. A tiny seed becomes a great tree. A pinch of yeast fills a whole bowl of dough. A small group of disciples tells the whole world about Jesus.

And a small child, maybe just like you, can pray, love, hug, smile, and share Jesus with the people around them. When you take Christ into your heart, he changes you from the inside out, just like yeast in the dough. And then, through you, he can change the people around you too. That is how God's kingdom keeps on growing!

Final Reflection Questions

What is the most important thing you learned this week about God's kingdom?

What is one small thing you will do this week to help God's kingdom grow?

How will you remember that size is not important to God?

This Week's Closing Prayer

Dear Jesus, help us remember that size is not important. Even the smallest one can help grow your kingdom. Thank you for loving us and choosing us, just the way we are, right now. We want to be mustard seeds and yeast for you. Change us from the inside out and use us to share your love with everyone we meet. In Jesus's name we pray, Amen.
